




MARCH CONFERENCE RECAP

Funding Opportunities

Buzzards Bay Watershed Stormwater Management and Wastewater Engineering Services Grant Program

Eligible projects include:

- 1) Stormwater remediation designs for discharges affecting marine waters.
- 2) Implementation and construction of existing stormwater designs for discharges affecting marine waters.
- 3) Support for tasks to achieve Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) compliance.
- 4) Feasibility studies and conceptual plans to enhance nitrogen removal from municipal wastewater treatment facilities using innovative or unconventional approaches.

Proposals must be submitted electronically and are due Tuesday, April 12, 2022 by 4:00 PM. Applicants must provide a non-federal match that will equal or exceed 33 percent of requested grant funds (i.e., 25 percent of total project costs). The RFP's Question and Answer period will close 4:00 PM, Tuesday, March 29, 2022.
