





Environmental Justice Populations in Massachusetts (arcgis.com)





Section 303 (d) lists are a subset of these waters – those that are impaired by a pollutant and in need of a TMDL.





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JUSTICE 40 U.S. ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY (US EPA)

➢ Justice 40 is a White House Initiative and is being tracked at the National level (US EPA HQ in Washington, DC).

>Mandates at least 40% of the benefits of certain federal programs must flow to disadvantaged communities.

A subset of US EPA programs are being tracked by HQ (US EPA):

- Drinking Water State Revolving Fund
- Clean Water State Revolving Fund
- Reducing Lead in Drinking Water
- CWA Section 319 NPS Pollution Competitive Grant Program
- Superfund
- Brownfields
- Diesel Emissions Reductions Act Program (DERA)

CW Clean Water State Revolving SRF Fund

•EJ communities are provided principal forgiveness for a portion of the SRF loan to ensure that they can afford projects that are necessary to comply with Clean Water Act requirements.

Introduction

Lead is a colorless and tasteless metal which can harm infants, children, and pregnant women. There is no known safe level of **lead in children's blood** and very low levels of lead have the potential to impact children's health. Children can ingest lead if it gets into their drinking water through **pipes, faucets, and other plumbing** that contain it. The only way to know if there is lead in your water is to test it.

Public Involvement Plan (PIP)

- A Public Involvement Plan (PIP) is a plan developed by MassDEP staff or Applicants to effectively engage with the public, specifically impacted EJ Populations.
- Staff should share the draft EJ PIP with the EJ stakeholders for input and feedback, questions, identification of additional stakeholders, etc. (The goal is to develop a collaborative document)
- Opportunity should be given to the impacted EJ population to provide input and identify community concerns about the specific key action/activity as part of the development of the PIP. (This should be done before public comment/public hearing).
- The PIP will guide MassDEP in receiving input from the public and will inform the agency's decisions and actions.

How MassDEP is Incorporating EJ Components into Regulations

REQUIREMENTS TO PROMOTE PUBLIC AWARENESS OF SEWAGE POLLUTION

- Permittee requirement for contacting news organizations that serve EJ populations for public advisory notifications.
- Language translation, as appropriate, for:
 - Public advisory notifications
 - Permanent warning signs at outfalls
 - Public notice of CSO Public Notification Plan
 - > Public health warnings and temporary signage at access points
- Media outlet that serves EJ populations for public notice of CSO Public Notification Plan






